Mr. Lines is currently an Operating Partner for Thoma Bravo a private equity firm.

Prior to Thoma Bravo, Mr. Lines was the Chief Executive Officer of Lines Consulting Group, which provided advisory services to private equity firms.

Mr. Lines experience also includes Executive Vice President and Chief Financial Officer of United Surgical Partners International, Inc., an international operator of surgery centers and hospitals; Senior Vice President and Chief Financial Officer of ITI Marketing Services, a private tele-services firm backed by Golder, Thoma, Cressey, Rauner; and 12 years in various financial management capacities at affiliates of AMR Corporation (American Airlines). During his tenure with AMR, he served as Director - Corporate Finance, Managing Director - Corporate Development and Chief Financial Officer of The SABRE Group. As Chief Financial Officer of SABRE, a global electronic travel distributor with \$1.5 billion in revenue, he played a key role in developing a plan, which tripled SABRE's operating income in three years, and managing the spin out of SABRE from American Airlines and its subsequent initial public offering.
